Good Shepherd Friends,

On Sunday, we will hear the following Gospel passage from the Gospel according to Mark:

One of the scribes came near and heard the Sadducees disputing with one another, and seeing that Jesus answered them well, he asked him, "Which commandment is the first of all?" Jesus answered, "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." Then the scribe said to him, "You are right, Teacher; you have truly said that 'he is one, and besides him there is no other'; and 'to love him with all the heart, and with all the understanding, and with all the strength,' and 'to love one's neighbor as oneself,'—this is much more important than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices." When Jesus saw that he answered wisely, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." After that no one dared to ask him any questions.

I would like to focus on the scribe's response to Jesus that loving God and loving neighbor are most important. He ends by saying "this is much more important than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices." What does this mean in regard to burn offerings and sacrifices? In the time of Jesus, an important way for one to get right with God, or stay right with God, was through burnt offerings and sacrifices in the Temple. With the statement, "this is much more important than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices," the scribe is saying that loving God and neighbor is what is most important in order for one to be right with God. Jesus then acknowledges this to be true.

This passage can be a reminder for us of what is most important to God, which is that we be people of love. If we want to be right with God, we must be loving. And it is not enough to say we love God; we must love our neighbor as well.

Sometimes we can look to other things as being most important to God, such as going to church, saying prayers, and reading the bible. These are all important, but they alone do not put us right with God. They can teach us about loving, but loving is what is most important.

God, help us through the power of the Holy Spirit, to love as Jesus loved.

The Good Shepherd Sunday Nursery

The Good Shepherd Sunday Nursery (for children through kindergarten age) is open during our 10am Sunday Services. Children are most welcome in the church, but the nursery will be available for them as well. Children can arrive at the nursery beginning at 9:50am and the nursery will close 10 minutes after the conclusion of the 10am Service. The Sunday Nursery is located on the third floor of the church, which can be accessed at the top of the church office stairwell in the back of the church building, through the door (marked Sunday Nursery). All nursery volunteers have undergone CORI background checks and received training, including the Safe Church training required by the Episcopal Church for all those who work with children. Mid-Week Eucharist

On Wednesdays at Noon, there is a celebration of the Eucharist in the church, which is open to all. This is an opportunity to gather for prayer and reflection; and be reminded of God's presence between Sundays. For those on your lunch break, the celebration of the midweek Eucharist is approximately 20 minutes. *There will not be a mid-week Service on Wednesday, November 13 & 27.*

Good & Green Team

Take-out meals are available from 4:30-4:45pm for those who choose not to eat indoors with others. Like all other indoor church functions, if you are not feeling well, please do not participate in the Good Shepherd Table indoor dining.

Food Pantry Schedule

The Food Pantry is open on the First Tuesday of the month from 3-6pm. People can pick up food from the Food Pantry one time per month.
