Good Shepherd Friends,

Speaking truth is not always welcomed. The biblical prophets were often ridiculed, rejected, and sometimes experienced violence because they dared to speak God's truth to those in leadership. This was also true for John the Baptist who dared to speak truth to King Herod and was put to death because of it. And it was certainly true of Jesus, who challenged the political, economic, and religious status quo which left many people oppressed and destitute and made to feel inferior even unloved by God. He gave people hope of another way of living in which all people are treated with the dignity and respect they deserve as children of God. It was because of this hope that he instilled within God's suffering people, that those in power put Jesus to death.

Yes, speaking God's truth, the truth that Jesus taught and lived is not always welcomed by those in power. But it was so very welcomed by the people Jesus ministered to. It was welcomed by the poor, the widows, the orphans, foreigners, women, the chronically ill, those with physical and mental disabilities. These people who had been marginalized, taken advantage of, abused and pushed away as being without worth welcomed the good news that God loved them and did not want for them to suffer.

Jesus spent most of his time with those who were suffering. He healed them with God's love as he listened to them and cried with them. He spoke to them about the Kingdom of God, which can be a present reality and not a future place for when we die. The Kingdom of God becomes a reality here on earth when we love one another, show kindness, respect, mercy, fairness, and equal justice. The Kingdom of God becomes a reality here on earth when we follow Jesus' Way of Love. The Kingdom of God becomes a reality here on earth when we see one another as children of God in all the beautiful colors, languages, cultures, and faith traditions in which God has created us.

Let us not be intimidated to speak the truth of God's love, which Jesus has shown us. With courage let us love as Jesus loved. Let us stand with our siblings who are being marginalized, taken advantage of, abused and pushed away as being without worth. Let us stand with those being rejected because of who they love, because of their gender identity, because out of desperation have come to this country to escape extreme poverty and violence. For it is with these now fearful siblings of ours, that Jesus once stood and would stand with today. And so must we.

I believe that it is with this in mind and heart that Washington Bishop Mariann Budde gave her sermon at the National Cathedral yesterday. I imagine that most of you have heard it or heard about it. It was a sermon which I believe Jesus would have given. For it was a sermon based on the teachings of Jesus. With a respectful, yet direct tone, it spoke God's truth to power. Bishop Mariann's sermon was about the good news that all are loved equally by God and should be treated with dignity, mercy, and compassion as they are all the children of God.

2025 Annual Meeting Journal

Black History Month: Education and Reflection Opportunities

All will be held in the Church Education/Meeting Room

- On Wednesday, January 29 from 6-8:30pm, we will watch and reflect on the documentary film entitled "<u>Freedom Summer: Mississippi</u> 1964." This documentary film concerns the struggle for voting rights in Mississippi in the Summer of 1964.
- On Sunday, February 9, from 11:45-1:15, we will watch and reflect on the documentary film entitled "Backs Against the Wall: The <u>Howard Thurman</u> Story." This documentary film explores the life and legacy of one of the most important religious figures of the 20th century, planting the seeds of the non-violent Civil Rights Movement.
- On Sunday, February 16, from 11:45-1:15, we will watch and reflect on the film entitled "Brother Outsider: The Life of Bayard Rustin." This film explores the life of Bayard Rustin, a visionary activist and strategist who has been called "the invisible man" of the civil rights movement.

Sunday School

Sunday School is generally held during the first half of our 10am Sunday Service on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month. For the months of January and February, the Sunday School will be held on the 1st and 2nd Sunday due to the holidays during those months. The Sunday School is located in the church meeting room, in the office area. All Sunday School volunteers have undergone CORI background checks and received training, including the Safe Church training required by the Episcopal Church for all those who work with children. The Good Shepherd Sunday Nursery

The Good Shepherd Sunday Nursery (for children through kindergarten age) is open during our 10am Sunday Services. Children are most welcome in the church, but the nursery will be available for them as well. Children can arrive at the nursery beginning at 9:50am and the nursery will close 10 minutes after the conclusion of the 10am Service. The Sunday Nursery is located on the third floor of the church, which can be accessed at the top of the church office stairwell in the back of the church building, through the door (marked Sunday Nursery). All nursery volunteers have undergone CORI background checks and received training, including the Safe Church training required by the Episcopal Church for all those who work with children. If you have questions about the nursery or would like to

WCTV Sunday Service Coverage

WCTV, the Wareham local access channel, will now be broadcasting recordings of our Sunday Services. The recorded Services will air a week later. WCTV can be found on Comcast channel 9 and Verizon channel 30. This is a good way to share Jesus' message of love and compassion with our Wareham community, and also let people know about our Good Shepherd community.

Prayer Request Book

In the back of the church on Sunday mornings, there is a Prayer Request Book. As you come into the church each Sunday, you are welcome to record in the Prayer Request Book the names of those who need prayers. During the prayers of the people, we pray for "all those whose names have been recorded in the Prayer Request Book."

Sunday Coffee Hour

Every Sunday, following the 10am Sunday Service, coffee hour is held in the Church Hall. Coffee hour is an opportunity for us to further get to know one another and share our lives with one another. The wearing of a facemask is welcome, for those who choose to wear one. Like all other indoor church functions, if you are not feeling well, please do not participate at coffee hour.

Good Shepherd Table

Good Shepherd's Table serves a free in-person meal, which is open to the public, every Thursday at 4:30pm. Take-out meals are available from 4:30-4:45pm for those who choose not to eat indoors with others. Like all other indoor church functions, if you are not feeling well, please do not participate in the Good Shepherd Table indoor dining.
