Good Shepherd Friends,

What does it mean to be a follower of Jesus? What does it mean to faithful to God and to Jesus? Is it simply going to church on Sundays? Is it simply reading the bible? Is it simply to pray every day, asking God to intervene in such a way as to benefit ourselves and to benefit some others who are important to us? I don't think so. Worshiping God and Jesus, reading the Bible, and praying are not enough. To be a follower of Jesus, to be faithful to God and to Jesus we must follow the teachings of Jesus, we must live as Jesus lived.

Too many who call themselves Christians, do not faithfully follow his teachings or live the way he lived. Too many are unapologetically disobedient to the commandment of love. Below is the passage from Luke's Gospel, that we will hear on Sunday. It is one of many such passages in the Gospels, which show that it is not easy to follow Jesus. It is much easier to simply go to church, read the bible and pray every day, but these alone do no constitute faithfulness to God and to Jesus. This is what Jesus had to say about faithfulness in the Gospel passage for this coming Sunday.

Jesus said, "I say to you that listen, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. If anyone strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also; and from anyone who takes away your coat do not withhold even your shirt. Give to everyone who begs from you; and if anyone takes away your goods, do not ask for them again. Do to others as you would have them do to you. "If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love them. If you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners do the same. If you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, to receive as much again. But love your enemies, do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return. Your reward will be great, and you will be children of the Most High; for he is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful. "Do not judge, and you will not be judged; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven; give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap; for the measure you give will be the measure you get back." (Luke 6:27-38)

If we want to be faithful to God and to Jesus, if we want our country to be more "Christian," this is what it means to be more in line with the teachings of Jesus and the way he has shown us. When we do otherwise, we are being unfaithful.

We have a lot of work to do. Let us keep striving to be faithful to God and Jesus. Let us stand firm in our desire to follow Jesus, to obey his commandment of love. Let us partner with Jesus in building the Kingdom of God, and no one else's. And let us do so together, empowered by the Spirit of God.

Lenten Spiritual Renewal Sessions

You are invited to participate in Good Shepherd's annual Lenten Spiritual Renewal sessions (LSRS). This year we will read and discuss the Marcus Borg book entitled "Convictions." In this book, Borg writes provocatively and compellingly on the beliefs that can deeply ground us and guide us, such as: God is real and a mystery; salvation is more about this life than an afterlife; the Bible can be true without being literally true; Jesus's death on the cross matters—but not because he paid for our sins; God is passionate about justice and the poor; and to love God is to love like God. We will discuss this book and our own faith beliefs as they have evolved during our lifetimes. These sessions will be offered in a small group format, beginning the week of March 9. There will be three groups, each group will meet for 5 weeks (a total of five sessions), and each session will last an hour and a half. There are both in-person and online options. Please Stay Home When You're Not Feeling Well

This is a reminder that if you have covid or another contagious illness, please do not come to the church. Basically, if you are not feeling well, please stay home. It is important that you stay home and rest, and it is important that we be vigilant in order not to spread viruses with one another. Sunday School

Sunday School is generally held during the first half of our 10am Sunday Service on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month. For the months of February, the Sunday School will be held on the 1st and 2nd Sunday due to the holiday this month. The Sunday School is located in the church meeting room, in the office area. All Sunday School volunteers have undergone CORI background checks and received training, including the Safe Church training required by the Episcopal Church for all those who work with children. The Good Shepherd Sunday Nursery

The Good Shepherd Sunday Nursery (for children through kindergarten age) is open during our 10am Sunday Services. Children are most welcome in the church, but the nursery will be available for them as well. Children can arrive at the nursery beginning at 9:50am and the nursery will close 10 minutes after the conclusion of the 10am Service. The Sunday Nursery is located on the third floor of the church, which can be accessed at the top of the church office stairwell in the back of the church building, through the door (marked Sunday Nursery). All nursery volunteers have undergone CORI background checks and received training, including the Safe Church training required by the Episcopal Church for all those who work with children. He prays that "this mantle be a safe haven...a sacred place of security and well-being... sustaining and embracing in good times as well as difficult ones." It can also be modified to make a man's lap robe. All patterns, of course, are welcomed. If needed, yarn will be provided. If you would like to support the prayer shawl ministry but do not knit or crochet, ask Judy about a way you can help.

WCTV Sunday Service Coverage

WCTV, the Wareham local access channel, will now be broadcasting recordings of our Sunday Services. The recorded Services will air a week later. WCTV can be found on Comcast channel 9 and Verizon channel 30. This is a good way to share Jesus' message of love and compassion with our Wareham community, and also let people know about our Good Shepherd community.

Prayer Request Book

In the back of the church on Sunday mornings, there is a Prayer Request Book. As you come into the church each Sunday, you are welcome to record in the Prayer Request Book the names of those who need prayers. During the prayers of the people, we pray for "all those whose names have been recorded in the Prayer Request Book."

Sunday Coffee Hour

Every Sunday, following the 10am Sunday Service, coffee hour is held in the Church Hall. Coffee hour is an opportunity for us to further get to know one another and share our lives with one another.
