Good Shepherd Friends,

On Sunday we will hear a passage from Luke's version of the Good News (Gospel) of Jesus. It begins with these words:

"the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God....."

Wow. They were "pressing in on him." What was Jesus saying to them that would have people so eager to hear his words that they pressed in on him? What could he possibly have to say to them that they would take the time to find him and listen to his every word? This particular passage does not share with us what Jesus was saying that day.

Based on many other passages in the Gospels, I image Jesus was sharing a message of hope. The lives of most of the people that Jesus encountered were difficult. They were burdened by the loss of their ancestral lands, excessive taxation to support Roman occupation and the building projects of King Herod, and the burden of not knowing if there would be enough food to feed one's family. Then there were some of the religious authorities who seemed more focused on appeasing the Romans in order to maintain the business of the Temple, and less focused on ministering to the suffering ones. And on top of that, some of the religious leaders brought on more suffering with burdensome adherence to laws, and through harsh judgements of one's worthiness before God.

Yes, I image that Jesus' words gave them hope. Hope of a new day. Hope of a time when oppression by the Romans and by some of the religious leaders would end. Hope of a time when their suffering would give way to peace, and their dignity as children of God would be restored.

I image Jesus saying to them that the Kingdom of God must begin today. God hears your suffering at the hands of our leaders. God hears your fear and your despair. God hears your longing for a new day. God hears your fading hope that God will one day act and all will be made right; your fading hope of a new day when the poor, the sick, the lowly, and the oppressed will be comforted and not pushed away. God hears you. I hear you.

We also need to press in and listen to our teacher and friend Jesus, to be reassured that God is with us and that God will not leave us and to allow Jesus to comfort us and heal us of the fear and hopelessness that sometimes threatens to overwhelm us.

We also need to be reminded that Jesus invites us to join him in building the Kingdom of God, which he never promised would be easy. We need to be reminded that those who wish to be faithful to Jesus must follow him. We must live like him and love like him. And we must do so even in the face of opposition, especially in the face of opposition. In difficult times, when those to who Jesus ministered most closely are being pushed away and ignore by others, be must double down on our commitment to carry out Jesus' mission of love and compassion.

So let us press in dear friends. Let us press in and listen to his words. Let us press in and be comforted. Let us press in and love as he loved. And let us do so together. This is what is required of us. This is what is expected of us..

The Good Shepherd Sunday Nursery

The Good Shepherd Sunday Nursery (for children through kindergarten age) is open during our 10am Sunday Services. Children are most welcome in the church, but the nursery will be available for them as well. Children can arrive at the nursery beginning at 9:50am and the nursery will close 10 minutes after the conclusion of the 10am Service. The Sunday Nursery is located on the third floor of the church, which can be accessed at the top of the church office stairwell in the back of the church building, through the door (marked Sunday Nursery). All nursery volunteers have undergone CORI background checks and received training, including the Safe Church training required by the Episcopal Church for all those who work with children. If you have questions about the nursery or would like to volunteer, please contact the church office (508-295-2840). The registration form can be downloaded from our Good Shepherd website (www.goodshepherdwareham.org). *The Sunday Nursery will be closed on February 16 (Holiday weekend).*

WCTV Sunday Service Coverage

WCTV, the Wareham local access channel, will now be broadcasting recordings of our Sunday Services. The recorded Services will air a week later. WCTV can be found on Comcast channel 9 and Verizon channel 30. This is a good way to share Jesus' message of love and compassion with our Wareham community, and also let people know about our Good Shepherd community.

Prayer Request Book

In the back of the church on Sunday mornings, there is a Prayer Request Book. As you come into the church each Sunday, you are welcome to record in the Prayer Request Book the names of those who need prayers. During the prayers of the people, we pray for "all those whose names have been recorded in the Prayer Request Book."

Sunday Coffee Hour

Every Sunday, following the 10am Sunday Service, coffee hour is held in the Church Hall. Coffee hour is an opportunity for us to further get to know one another and share our lives with one another. The wearing of a facemask is welcome, for those who choose to wear one. Like all other indoor church functions, if you are not feeling well, please do not participate at coffee hour.

Good Shepherd Table

Good Shepherd's Table serves a free in-person meal, which is open to the public, every Thursday at 4:30pm. Take-out meals are available from 4:30-4:45pm for those who choose not to eat indoors with others. Like all other indoor church functions, if you are not feeling well, please do not participate in the Good Shepherd Table indoor dining.
