Good Shepherd Friends,

Have you ever done something or said something that you later regretted? Maybe you hurt someone in the process. I imagine that each of us has. It may have happened this week or even today. Or it may have happened years ago, and it still haunts you. Even if we are reconciled with the ones we hurt, we can still carry feelings of guilt and regret many years later. “I wish I wouldn’t have said that.” “I wish I could take it back.”

Sometimes, it is easier to forgive someone who has hurt us than it is to forgive ourselves when we have hurt others. But is this the way God wants for us to live? Does God want for us not to forgive ourselves? I don’t think so.

Now, let us be clear, when we hurt another person God wants for us to express our sorrow to the person we hurt and to seek their forgiveness. But once we have done that, and learned from the experience, it is important that we let it go. Holding onto regret and guilt will only distract us from our call to be messengers of God’s love and mercy.

Again, it is not always easy to forgive ourselves. We need God help. So, we turn to God and ask for God to give us the courage and strength to do so. Is there something you have not forgiven yourself for?

### **Children's Sunday Service – March 30**

Our next Children's Sunday Service will be held on Sunday, March 30 during our 10am Service. This Service will focus on the children of our Good Shepherd community. The prayers, music, readings, and the sermon will speak to the children. All are invited to participate in these children focused Eucharistic Services. There will be no age restriction. Everyone can benefit from these Services. Let us gather in support of our young families and their children.

### **Birthday and Anniversary Blessings**

On the first Sunday of the month we recognize, with a special blessing at our Sunday Services, those who celebrate birthdays and anniversaries during that month. On Sunday, April 6, we will celebrate with those who have April birthdays and anniversaries.

### **Donations For Our Good Shepherd Easter Egg Hunt**

In a few short weeks, we will be celebrating Easter. Many of us likely remember the joyful day as children because we got to have an Easter Egg Hunt. If you would like to help us make that possible for our children, please consider filling a dozen plastic Easter eggs filled with individually wrapped candy or stickers. The plastic easter eggs can be found in the back of the church. A basket will be placed at the Church's back entrance to collect the eggs and we need to have them by Palm Sunday, April 13 (we will also accept monetary donations to help purchase extra eggs and candy). The Easter egg hunt will begin after the 10:00 Service on Easter Sunday. Thanking you in advance for any assistance in helping make the Easter Egg Hunt a success!

### **Coffee Hour Hosts Needed**

We would like to invite every household to host coffee hour, which follows our 10am Sunday Service. You can host by yourselves or join with another household. Coffee hour hosts are asked to bring a quart size carton of half-n-half, a half-gallon carton of juice, and some snacks to feed 6-8 children and about 30 adults (for example: cake, pastry, cookies, brownies, cheese and crackers, fruit, cut up veggies, etc.). Hosts arrive at the church by 9:15 to set up for coffee hour. Judy Govoni will be there to assist you. Hosts are also asked to clean up after coffee hour. The idea is that each household would host coffee hour about every three or four months. The sign-up list can be found on the food table during coffee hour.

### **Easter Flower and Decoration Donations**

Donations to the Easter Flower and Decoration Fund can be made in memory of a deceased loved one or in thanksgiving for blessings in your life. Donation envelopes/forms are available in the back of the church sanctuary and on our church website. Your donations will help us to decorate the church for the celebration Easter. ### **Mid-Week Eucharist**

On Wednesdays at Noon, there is a celebration of the Eucharist in the church, which is open to all. This is an opportunity to gather for prayer and reflection; and be reminded of God's presence between Sundays. For those on your lunch break, the celebration of the mid-week Eucharist is approximately 20 minutes.

### **Please Stay Home When You're Not Feeling Well**

This is a reminder that if you have covid or another contagious illness, please do not come to the church. Basically, if you are not feeling well, please stay home. It is important that you stay home and rest, and it is important that we be vigilant in order not to spread viruses with one another. Remember, the 10am Sunday Service is offered on Facebook Live every Sunday, and the link to the recorded Service is sent to those on our church email list following the live Service. Stay home, rest, and participate online.

## **Sunday School**

Sunday School is held during the first half of our 10am Sunday Service on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month. The Sunday School is located in the church meeting room, in the office area. All Sunday School volunteers have undergone CORI background checks and received training, including the Safe Church training required by the Episcopal Church for all those who work with children. ## **The Good Shepherd Sunday Nursery**

The Good Shepherd Sunday Nursery (for children through kindergarten age) is open during our 10am Sunday Services. Children are most welcome in the church, but the nursery will be available for them as well. Children can arrive at the nursery beginning at 9:50am and the nursery will close 10 minutes after the conclusion of the 10am Service. The Sunday Nursery is located on the third floor of the church, which can be accessed at the top of the church office stairwell in the back of the church building, through the door (marked Sunday Nursery). All nursery volunteers have undergone CORI background checks and received training, including the Safe Church training required by the Episcopal Church for all those who work with children. If you have questions about the nursery or would like to volunteer, please contact the church office (508-295-2840). The registration form can be downloaded from our Good Shepherd website ([www.goodshepherdwareham.org](http://www.goodshepherdwareham.org)). *Because there will be a Children's Service on March 30, the Sunday Nursery will not be open on March 30.*

## **Good & Green Team: Meetings & Collection**

Our monthly meetings take place on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the month from 9-9:45am in the Church Hall. All are welcome! Every 3rd Sunday of the month, the Good and Green Team collects 5 cent redeemable cans and bottles, and used sneakers; which help us raise money for sustainable efforts in our church. ## **Be Aware of Scammers**

Be aware of scammers who send emails or texts to church members in the name of their pastors (the fake emails are very close to the pastor's authentic email address), asking them to send gifts cards electronically to support those in need during a crisis. Please do not do so. I would never ask you to send electronic gift cards. If you are not certain about an email or text, please call me or email me (using my correct email) directly with your questions. *Pastor Dan*

## **Prayer Shawl Ministry**

As a way of reaching out to those who are ill or struggling in some way, parishioners have knitted shawls to be given to those who can benefit from receiving these gifts of warmth and comfort. Pastor Dan blesses each shawl before it is given. He prays that "this mantle be a safe haven...a sacred place of security and well-being... sustaining and embracing in good times as well as difficult ones." Please contact Judy Ellis (Prayer Shawl Ministry Coordinator) or Pastor Dan if you would like a shawl for yourself or someone else. If you would like to be a part of this ministry, and join our knitting team, please be in touch with Judy Ellis (508-295-5318). There is a very basic pattern that makes a beautiful, lacey shawl. It can also be modified to make a man's lap robe. All patterns, of course, are welcomed. If needed, yarn will be provided. If you would like to support the prayer shawl ministry but do not knit or crochet, ask Judy about a way you can help.

## **Prayer Request Book**

In the back of the church on Sunday mornings, there is a Prayer Request Book. As you come into the church each Sunday, you are welcome to record in the Prayer Request Book the names of those who need prayers. During the prayers of the people, we pray for "all those whose names have been recorded in the Prayer Request Book."

### **Sunday Coffee Hour**

Every Sunday, following the 10am Sunday Service, coffee hour is held in the Church Hall. Coffee hour is an opportunity for us to further get to know one another and share our lives with one another. The wearing of a facemask is welcome, for those who choose to wear one. Like all other indoor church functions, if you are not feeling well, please do not participate at coffee hour.

### **Good Shepherd Table**

Good Shepherd's Table serves a free in-person meal, which is open to the public, every Thursday at 4:30pm. Take-out meals are available from 4:30-4:45pm for those who choose not to eat indoors with others. Like all other indoor church functions, if you are not feeling well, please do not participate in the Good Shepherd Table indoor dining.
