Good Shepherd Friends,

What do you understand God to be like? What is the nature of God? Do you have an image of God? I imagine all of us have asked these questions, and you may be asking them at this time in your life as well. There is no right or wrong answer to these questions. They are questions that our ancestors in faith have attempted to answer in every generation. The truth is that God is beyond our complete understanding. We only have glimpses of God.

I have come to believe that God is the power or energy behind all of creation. I believe that God is not distant from us but lived among us through the life and ministry of Jesus and still lives within us through the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit being God's abiding presence in my life, which can empower me as I strive to follow Jesus in love and compassion for all.

Through Jesus, and empowered by the Holy Spirit, I have come to understand that God is love, and that all God wants for us is to accept God's love and generously share God's love with others. This isn't always convenient and easy, but it is what faithfulness to God is all about.

Ask me in a couple of years, and my understanding of God will likely be a little different. Every year brings new experiences of life, which help form my understanding of God. Our ancestors in faith also evolved in their understanding of who God was for them, which is how they were able to declare that God is Father (Creator), Son, and Holy Spirit; three aspects of the presence of God in their lives.

So, I ask you again, what do you understand God to be like? What is the nature of God? Do you have an image of God? Since no person can know the fulness of who God is, your answers to these questions are likely different today, than they were 10 years ago. And that is okay. Actually, that is good and healthy.

Coffee Hour Hosts Needed

We would like to invite every household to host coffee hour, which follows our 10am Sunday Service. You can host by yourselves or join with another household. Coffee hour hosts are asked to bring a quart size carton of half-n-half, a half-gallon carton of juice, and some snacks to feed 6-8 children and about 30 adults (for example: cake, pastry, cookies, brownies, cheese and crackers, fruit, cut up veggies, etc.). Hosts arrive at the church by 9:15 to set up for coffee hour. Judy Govoni will be there to assist you. Hosts are also asked to clean up after coffee hour. The idea is that each household would host coffee hour about every three or four months. The sign-up list can be found

on the food table during coffee hour.

Mid-Week Eucharist

On Wednesdays at Noon, there is a celebration of the Eucharist in the church, which is open to all. This is an opportunity to gather for prayer and reflection; and be reminded of God's presence between Sundays. For those on your lunch break, the celebration of the mid-week Eucharist is approximately 20 minutes.

Prayer Request Book

In the back of the church on Sunday mornings, there is a Prayer Request Book. As you come into the church each Sunday, you are welcome to record in the Prayer Request Book the names of those who need prayers. During the prayers of the people, we pray for "all those whose names have been recorded in the Prayer Request Book."

Sunday Coffee Hour

Every Sunday, following the 10am Sunday Service, coffee hour is held in the Church Hall. Coffee hour is an opportunity for us to further get to know one another and share our lives with one another. The wearing of a facemask is welcome, for those who choose to wear one. Like all other indoor church functions, if you are not feeling well, please do not participate at coffee hour.

Good Shepherd Table

Good Shepherd's Table serves a free in-person meal, which is open to the public, every Thursday at 4:30pm. Takeout meals are available from 4:30-4:45pm for those who choose not to eat indoors with others. Like all other indoor church functions, if you are not feeling well, please do not participate in the Good Shepherd Table indoor dining.
