Good Shepherd operates a nursery on Sunday from 9:50 –11:10am for infants and children through kindergarten (age 5-6) for those who wish to use it. The nursery is staffed by two adults who have completed Safe Church Training and a CORI background check. *The Sunday Nursery is closed for the summer. It will reopen on September 7.*

Presider: Blessed are you, holy and living One.*People:* You come to your people and set them free.

The Service Introduction

The Confession (8am service only)

Deacon:

Remembering that we are loved and that we sometimes fall short in following Jesus' commandment to love one another, let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

People:

Most merciful God, we confess of the ways we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. For the times we have not loved you with our whole heart; and have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. Have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your name. *Amen.*

Absolution (8am service only)

Presider: Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. *Amen.*

The Opening Prayer

Presider: The Lord be with you. People: And also with you. Presider: Together, let us pray.

O God of creation, eternal majesty, you preside over land and sea, sunshine and storm. By your strength pilot us, by your power preserve us, by your wisdom instruct us, and by your hand protect us, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. *Amen*.

First Reading: 2 Corinthians 6:1-13 (8am service only)

As we work together with Christ, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. For he says,

"At an acceptable time I have listened to you,

and on a day of salvation I have helped you."

See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see-- we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.

We have spoken frankly to you Corinthians; our heart is wide open to you. There is no restriction in our affections, but only in yours. In return-- I speak as to children--open wide your hearts also.

Reader: The Word of the Lord *People:* **Thanks be to God.**

Psalm 107:1-3, 23-32 (8am service only)

Reader: Let us recite Psalm 107 responsively by half verse

- ¹ Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, * **and his mercy endures for ever.**
- ² Let all those whom the LORD has redeemed proclaim * that he redeemed them from the hand of the foe.
- ³ He gathered them out of the lands; * from the east and from the west, from the north and from the south.
- ²³ Some went down to the sea in ships * and plied their trade in deep waters;
- ²⁴ They beheld the works of the LORD * **and his wonders in the deep.**
- ²⁵ Then he spoke, and a stormy wind arose, * which tossed high the waves of the sea.
- ²⁶ They mounted up to the heavens and fell back to the depths; * **their hearts melted because of their peril.**
- ²⁷ They reeled and staggered like drunkards * **and were at their wits' end.**
- ²⁸ Then they cried to the LORD in their trouble, * and he delivered them from their distress.
- ²⁹ He stilled the storm to a whisper * **and quieted the waves of the sea.**
- ³⁰ Then were they glad because of the calm, * and he brought them to the harbor they were bound for.
- ³¹ Let them give thanks to the LORD for his mercy * **and the wonders he does for his children.**
- ³² Let them exalt him in the congregation of the people * **and praise him in the council of the elders.**

The Holy Gospel: Mark 4:35-41 (8am service only)

Deacon: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark. *People:* **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

When evening had come, Jesus said to his disciples, "Let us go across to the other side." And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. A great windstorm arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. He said to them, "Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?" And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?"

Deacon: The Gospel of the Lord. People: **Praise to you, Lord Christ.**

The Prayer of St. Francis Presider and People: Lord, make us instruments of your peace. Where there is hatred, let us sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is discord, union; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy. Grant that we may not so much seek to be consoled as to console; to be understood as to understand: to be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive; it is in pardoning that we are pardoned; and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life. Amen.

Communion






