

Good Shepherd operates a nursery on Sunday from 9:50 –11:10am for infants and children through kindergarten (age 5-6) for those who wish to use it. The nursery is staffed by two adults who have completed Safe Church Training and a CORI background check. **No Sunday Nursery on February 15.**

The Holy Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12

Deacon: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

it is in pardoning that we are pardoned;


and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life. Amen.


