Good Shepherd Friends,

This coming Sunday we will read the following passage from the Gospel according to Matthew:

*"Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd."*

Jesus had a message that was understood to be good news by most of those who heard it; by the broken, disenfranchised, and forgotten people of the world. He restored wholeness to their broken hearts, minds, and spirits. He let them know that they were not alone, that God was with them and that he was with them. He witnessed God's love and mercy for them. He gave them hope for a new, fair, and compassionate world; where justice for all would be a reality. He called this the kingdom of God. And the people were hungry for such a reality. They couldn't get enough of his teachings and his healing ministry.

Jesus continues to heal us of our brokenness. He teaches us the ways of love. What are the broken parts of your life that need healing? What are your fears and your insecurities? What is your pain?

Jesus is our Good Shepherd who cares for us and wants to guide us and make us whole. Turn to him and talk with him. Surrender the illusion of control over your life and let him shepherd you. Then trust him and look for the messengers of love and healing that he has sent your way.

No matter how difficult your path, with the Good Shepherd beside you, you will be alright. The light of God's love will be your guide and your strength.

### **Turning Point Wareham Looking for Volunteers**

It is a not-for-profit, community-based organization serving as a day resource and referral center for those facing housing instability. We provide collaborative, respectful, and supportive services and are committed to empowering individuals who are ready to help themselves.

**Intake Volunteer** – reporting to the Executive Director, interacts with clients seeking assistance, guidance, and support for a variety of life challenges. Training provided. Minimum three-hour commitment each week.

**Public Relations Volunteer** – reporting to the WACH President, the PR volunteer will be responsible for framing one or two press releases each month relating to Turning Point activities and programs. The PR volunteer will contribute to the quarterly Turning Point Newsletter and will provide input to other communication pieces for Turning Point use. Commitment is a minimum of five hours each month.

**Social Media Volunteer** – reporting to the WACH President, volunteer will have experience with website management, Facebook postings, and FB oversight. Volunteers may also have experience with other social media platforms that may benefit Turning Point. Commitment is a minimum of five hours each month.

As a way of reaching out to those who are ill or struggling in some way, parishioners have knitted blankets to be given to those who can benefit from receiving these gifts of warmth and comfort. Pastor Dan blesses each blanket before it is given. He prays that "this mantle be a safe haven...a sacred place of security and well-being... sustaining and embracing in good times as well as difficult ones." Please contact Judy Ellis (Prayer Blanket Ministry Coordinator) or Pastor Dan if you would like a prayer blanket for yourself or someone else. *If you would like to be a part of this ministry, and join our knitting team, please be in touch with Judy Ellis (508-295-5318).* There is a very basic pattern that makes beautiful prayer blankets. All patterns, of course, are welcomed. If needed, yarn will be provided. If you would like to support the prayer shawl ministry but do not knit or crochet, ask Judy about a way you can help.

### **Coffee Hour Hosts Needed**

Every Sunday, following the 10am Sunday Service, coffee hour is held in the Church Hall. Coffee hour is an opportunity for us to further get to know one another and share our lives with one another. Every household is invited to host coffee hour, which follows our 10am Sunday Service. You can host by yourselves or join with another household. Coffee hour hosts are asked to bring a quart size carton of half-n-half, a half-gallon carton of juice, and some snacks to feed 6-8 children and about 30 adults (for example: cake, pastry, cookies, brownies, cheese and crackers, fruit, cut up veggies, etc.). Hosts arrive at the church by 9:15 to set up for coffee hour. Judy Govoni will be there to assist you. Hosts are also asked to clean up after coffee hour. The idea is that each household would host coffee hour about every three or four months. The sign-up list and more information can be found on the wall behind the coffee hour food table.

### **Food Pantry Wish List**

Church of the Good Shepherd is partnering with Damien's Place Food Pantry by provided needed items for those using the pantry. These items are difficult for Damien's to purchase from the Greater Boston Food Bank. Damien's is looking specifically for **cereal, jars of jelly, and juice**.
